### FROM THE PRESIDENT

The end of our financial year occurred on 31<sup>st</sup> May 2011, and it has been encouraging to see the number of members renewing their membership again, even despite the poor weather conditions we have experienced of late. We have managed to maintain only a slight increase in the membership fees for the incoming year and are confident that our financial management will ensure budgets are met.

In the financial year that has just past, we have managed to achieve a number of our strategic objectives and look forward to another year of similar progress. We are currently upgrading some of our facilities and giving the Clubhouse a little deserved attention with a change of colour and some minor renovations. We are still aiming to progress with a more major renovation to the Clubhouse through the later part of this year and are currently dealing with Council on a few issues that need clarification. Once detailed plans are completed, we will call for tenders to complete the project.

It is with regret that we accept the resignation of director, Paul Wilson. Paul has been a valued member of the Board and a big supporter of the Club for a long time. His involvement in specialised projects such as the Junior Development and Clubhouse Development has been greatly appreciated. On behalf of the Board, I wish to express our thanks.

### CEO NEWS

Golf Clubs in general around our region and in the South East of Queensland have been subject to some erratic weather patterns which have resulted in some severe reductions in green fee revenues. Many of my colleagues in the region are feeling this effect, some in the capacity of over \$100,000 in reduced revenue from the course. I am happy to report that we have not suffered to this capacity with our revenues showing only a slight reduction from last year's results – the Clubhouse revenues, however, have suffered the most. The problem we have encountered is not so much the amount of rainfall, but the timing of the rainfall. We have experienced rainfall at times when fields are about to start teeing off, which results in no players, then no Clubhouse trade. All our costs are still borne though. But despite these challenges, our end result, financially, will be ok – an overall net loss is expected but the cash position of the Club as at 31<sup>st</sup> May 2011 has improved by over \$250,000 from the 31<sup>st</sup> May 2010 (last year).

#### BUDGET 2011-2012

The Club's 2011-2012 Operational and Capital Budgets have been recently passed by the Board, and will include the forecast of a slight profit, another positive cash flow year and some much needed capital spending. A concise copy of these budgets will be available as a part of the impending Annual Report.

#### AMENITIES UPGRADES

Members will have noticed that the upgrade of the Clubhouse Ladies and Men's amenities are now completed. Feedback has been extremely positive and the Board is very happy with the results. The Men's toilet upgrade has come in under budget by nearly 10% even with the addition of the different urinals (which allow for retrofitting of water if required) and the Jet Dryer hand dryer which were not a part of the original budget. The urinals are waterless and all toilets and tap ware are water efficient,

which should result in significant water savings to the Club. Thanks go to those members involved especially Paul Wilson and Peter Gibson for their coordination of the project.

The Women's Committee have also upgraded the Women's Locker room amenities and I am sure the improvements have been well received. We would like to thank the ladies for their assistance and attention to detail.

#### EXTERIOR PAINT WORKS

By now you will have noticed the new facelift the Clubhouse has received on its exterior. We have progressed to a more modern and subtle finish that should produce a better street appeal.

We may be removing the balcony hand railing in a progressive fashion to enable us to have them powder coated and repainted. This is envisaged to take several weeks due to the need to have fire exit capabilities throughout trading periods. Please be aware of these works.

#### GREEN FEES INCREASE

Attached later in this publication are the changes to our green and competition fees. Members will notice an increase in the competition fee of fifty cents (50c) which will take effect as at Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> July 2011.

To assist the Club in streamlining its costs and to support local businesses, we are putting together a Member Business Listing. This listing will be used by the Board as a list to be used to source quotations for jobs that need doing or services that need providing. #### AGF MEMBERS SOCIAL PLAY – IMPORTANT NOTICE

Just a note to all AGF members who play socially reminding you that you still need to register at the Pro Shop prior to any play on the course. This means physically entering the Pro Shop and having your name entered into the timesheet. This is an essential requirement so that we can ensure that any incidents that could or may occur on the course, comply with any required insurance obligations and further, so that the Club is aware of your presence. I thank you in advance for your assistance with this matter.

#### BUGGY SHED DOORS

It has been brought to my attention that there are some members adjusting the sensors on the buggy sheds so as to keep the doors from closing. This practice is to cease immediately and any member caught tampering with the operation of these doors will face disciplinary action. I remind you that these doors were implemented to enhance the security of members motorised buggies and this practice breaches this security.

#### NEW BUGGY SHED

The Board of Directors have determined that expressions of interest will be sought from members who would like to house a buggy in a new shed. Expressions of interest can be lodged at the Club Office and priority will be given to those members who have their details lodged on the current Buggy Waiting list. Detailed later in this newsletter is the proposal to members.

I would like to thank all the players for their support of this event, with all proceeds going toward the purchase of some outdoor heaters for our balconies. I would especially like to thank Joe Postle and the team at 3D Paint and Colour for their ongoing support of this event, and look forward to next year. In the mean time, we pray for a drought so that Joe can bring the rain back when his event returns in May 2012.

## NEW MOTORISED CART STORAGE SHED

Expressions of Interest for rental required

### The Proposal:

- To finance the construction of the new facility to accommodate 32 electric motorised golf carts (2 person), each renter will be required to pay an amount of **\$3,400 upfront.**
- In return, the renter (member) will attain the rented space for **eight (8) years** and all rental fees, both usage fee and storage fee, will be waived for that term. Once the term expires, the space will revert to a year by year rental space and all associated fees will be payable.

### Other Conditions:

- Must hold space for at least two years. If member leaves or resigns within the two years and a suitable replacement renter is not sourced, refund given will be based on 6 years maximum (that is, max. \$2,550);
- Refunds requested after two years will be given upon application in writing and will be determined on a pro rata basis, per days remaining;
- Members on the current waiting list will be given first option;

- No payment of storage or usage fees for 8 years;
- Not subject to any increases storage or usage fees for 8 years;
- Refunds given upon application

## Golf Management Structure

Over the past couple of years there have been changes to the clubs golf management structure. In light of some members inquiries it is probably timely to reiterate those changes that have occurred. The package of changes and a brief overview are detailed in the following.

### History overview

Arguably we have over the last approximately ten years operated under a golf management structure that has been somewhat restrictive in moving the club forward from a golfing perspective. There are a number of references to poor communication and conflict between the Board of Directors (Board) and the subcommittees. That relationship over the years had been strained at times to say the least, which at the very basic level has been counterproductive to effective and efficient golf management within the club.

The past golf management structure promoted four somewhat autonomous groups within the club being the men's, women's, veterans committees and the Board itself. This structure lacked an effective communication flow and resulted in many instances over a number of years that saw these committees and the Board act in isolation of one another.

It must be stressed individual committee representatives have contributed significantly over the years and indeed the initiators of the previous structure showed great foresight in taking on a new challenge. Subsequently these changes are not reflective of their efforts but more a management structure that nurtured practices that in these times have restricted the chance of meeting the internal and external challenges the club is now and into the future will be facing.

The previous Board identified the need for the club to have a strategic perspective in managing all the clubs affairs and to instigate a 5 year plan that would move the organisation forward. Subsequently we now have a strategic direction for the club that will hold it in good stead to meet the present and future challenges and ultimately enhance members golfing and social experiences.

Change itself can be sometimes difficult, with cultural barriers and resistance to change causing some upheaval. It is with those thoughts in mind that the Board has given a lot of time to the issues before it and how we best place the club in these somewhat difficult times. To better address the issues of communication, golf development and future planning the previous Board reviewed all roles and responsibilities of Directors and approved a golf structure that would help achieve more effective and efficient management and strategic direction.

From a golfing perspective the running of competition and social golf, the management of the course, future course development and junior golf strategies are all very important areas that needed a definitive direction. As well as recognising and incorporating aspects of the previous committee structure.

Recently, there has been some enquiries regarding the demise of the "Men's Committee". However the loss of this committee was more a product of lack of interest by members to volunteer their scarce time, than any plan by the Board to remove it from the golf management structure. Indeed some Directors volunteered their services in the year prior to fill vacant positions and keep the committee viable. It was paramount for the Board to ensure we had a golf structure for the immediate and long term future. The new structure allows for a stronger representation for "men's competitions" across golfing committees and the Board itself with further enhancements to be proposed.

### Director of Golf

The Director of Golf position is one that has changed in duties and responsibilities considerably. This position is now responsible

for golf management and is one that reflects that of a Club Captain, as opposed to course maintenance. A name change would in the long run be appropriate, however that would be up to members to vote at an AGM, as per our constitution.

### Mi Club

The Mi Club golf competition management system has been implemented for daily competitions, and bookings in the club and on the internet. Some initial teething issues aside it has proved to be an effective golf management tool and reduced the need for a number of previous practices. Further improvements could also be forthcoming through point of sale and administration management.

### Match

The Match Committee is representative, of the old Men's Committee, Women's Committee, the Veterans Committee, Professional, Course Superintendent and is chaired by the Director of Golf.

This group, with others from time to time will be responsible through the Board for the running of golf competitions and for making recommendations to the Board regarding the promotion of golf from both an internal and external perspective. This will also include additional positions that will assist with men's golf competitions on a weekly basis.

The match committee maintains a budget, however this is now under the umbrella of the clubs financial criteria and is accessible to the match committee as required.

### Greens

As golf management and course maintenance are two distinct and important areas the need to separate course maintenance and provision for a specialist committee was considered essential.

The Greens Committee is now chaired by a Director appointed by the Board and has members with appropriate skills and experiences in golf course management and maintenance.

### Junior Golf

Junior development is also considered extremely important to the Clubs future. Subsequently the Board initiated the position of Junior Golf Liaison Officer (Director), responsible for recommending policy and strategic direction to the Board as well as providing a link between the Board and our hard working Junior Golf Coordinators.

A junior development group will oversee the promotion of golf and its development within the club. The Board recognises the need for a strong junior foundation that will be better placed to meet future challenges especially in the areas of attracting and maintaining younger players within a somewhat restricted local demographic.

The Board appointed Junior Golf Liaison Officer will chair the group which will consist of our junior golf coordinators and club professionals.

### Women/Veteran Committees

The Veterans and Women's committees have roles consistent with their respective NSW organisations and remain an important part of the clubs golf management structure. The makeup of these two committees is self determined and managed accordingly.

The focus for the Board is to continue building upon our strategic plan to ensure the Club is better placed to meet the challenges of the future whilst providing the best golfing and social experiences for members and guests. Further details of committee makeup or questions on golf management can be directed through the CEO or the Director of Golf in the first instance.
